

Head Start services provide significant educational, health, economic and social benefits. Beginning with healthy attachments in infancy, children receive early learning experiences which give children the skills they need for school success, and engage parents in their child's education. Listo is our literacy program for Spanish speaking families.



Successful Monitoring Reviews

In 2015-2016 Southern Oregon Head Start (SOHS) received two onsite monitoring reviews by national experts to ensure our program is in compliance with over 2500 performance standards and regulations.

The result: 100% in compliance

in the areas of Leadership, Governance and Management Systems and CLASS (Classroom Assessment Scoring System).

HEALTH STATS

92% of children up-to-date on medical exams

83% of pre-schoolers received a dental exam

Quality Rating and Improvement System (QRIS)

SOHS has applied to QRIS for each of our 25 Head Start and Early Head Start centers. The purpose of this statewide program is to rate licensed child care and pre-school facilities from 1 to 5 stars based on the quality of services they provide. Our results so far:
