Next add the "Ah" but with a left exchange. Watch and listen as some sounds pass over each other.

Teaches patience, taking turns and rhyming

Activity:

While sitting in circle before going to wash hands, play "Bubble gum"

Have them pretend to eat leaves and getting bigger and bigger. Now they are a great big caterpillar and they're getting sleepy, make a cocoon and go to sleep. When they wake up they chew a hole n their cocoon , put their head out and look around. They begin to crawl out and realize some of their legs have turned to wings. Tell them to stretch and flap their wings, ready to fly away to their next destination.
