Changing Child's Wet or Soiled Clothing Procedure

FOOD SERVICE STAFF/VOLUNTEERS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO ASSIST CHILDREN WITH CHANGING WET OR SOILED CLOTHING

PROCEDURE

- 1. Place supplies (wipes, new plastic bag, extra gloves) within reach
- 2. Put on disposable, vinyl gloves. Parents assisting their own child do not need gloves
- 3. Encourage the child to remove his own clothing if he can, assist as needed
- 4. If possible, drop the stool in the toilet and flush. Turn the clothes so soiled side is inside and have the child put the soiled clothes in new plastic bag. Double knot the bag to close.
- 5. Encourage the child to clean himself thoroughly, assist as needed
- 6. Encourage the child to redress himself, assist as needed.
- 7. Remove your gloves and wash your hands thoroughly with soap and warm, running water for at least 20 seconds. Dry hands thoroughly and use the paper towel to turn off the water
- 8. Have the child wash his hands using the posted hand washing procedure
- 9. Return the child to the supervised area.
- 10. Return to the bathroom.
- 11. Spray the toilet and anything the child has touched with sanitizing solution; let stand a minimum 2 minutes; wipe with paper towels or allow to air dry
- 12. Wash your hands thoroughly with soap and warm, running water for at least 20 seconds. Dry hands thoroughly and use the paper towel to turn off the water
- 13. Write the child's name on the plastic bag and put it in the child's cubby to go home
- 14. Report any **abnormal** skin or stool conditions (rash, unusual stool consistency, color, odor or frequency) to the parent and the Health Manager & Health & Nutrition Manger.
