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Health Services Advisory Committee (HSAC)

GENERAL PLAN/APPROACH:

Each grantee directly operating an Early Head Start or Head Start program, and each delegate agency, must establish and maintain a Health Services Advisory Committee (HSAC), which includes Head Start parents, professionals, and other volunteers from the community.

HEAD START PROGRAM PERFORMANCE STANDARDS:

1302.40 (b) - Health Services Advisory Committee

Our procedures are subject to adjustment based on Public Health needs or advisory from either our local, state or federal governing bodies. Any temporary modifications to procedures in this event will be documented and shared with staff.

PROCEDURE:

- The role of the HSAC is to advise in the planning, operation, and evaluation of health services.
- The HSAC assists in planning, accessing community health resources, and development of policies and procedures.
- HSAC members are recruited through personal contact and Policy Council.
- Appropriate members include physicians, nurses, dentists, dieticians, WIC, audiologists, optometrists, mental health professionals, allied health professionals, coordinated care provider representatives and parents.
- HSAC members may be consulted during the year as needs arise.
