This year's flu shot is more important than ever

An unexpected upside of GOVID-19 precautions such as masking indoors and avoiding crowds is that public health experts saw virtually no major flu outbreaks in the United States during the last two years.

That will likely change this year. With most mandatory GOVID-19 measures lifted and many people returning to pre-pandemic

activities, public health experts predict a significant increase in flu cases this year. And because we've experienced virtually no flu for the last two years, our immune systems are not as prepared to fight the flu virus.

Flu and GOVID-19

Researchers are particularly worried about Oregon's hospitals' ability to handle simultaneous increases in flu and GOVID-19 cases that require hospitalization.

"National modelers are expecting a resurgence of flu this year, in addition to the GOVID-19 virus that we are also expecting to pick up during the fall and winter," said Peter Graven, director of the Oregon Health & Science University's (OHSU) Office of Advanced Analytics.

According to Graven's latest <u>GOVID-19 forecast</u>, GOVID-19 cases should continue dropping until November, when they are expected to climb again.

La vacuna contra la gripe este año es más importante que nunca

Una ventaja inesperada de las precauciones tomadas contra el GOVID-19, como el uso del cubrebocas en interiores y evitar las multitudes, fue que los expertos en salud pública prácticamente no vieron brotes importantes de gripe en los Estados Unidos durante los últimos dos años.

Pero eso probablemente cambiará este año. Con la mayoría de las medidas obligatorias de GOVID-19 levantadas y

muchas personas regresando a las actividades previas a la pandemia, los expertos en salud pública predicen un aumento importante en los casos de gripe este año. Y debido a que prácticamente no hemos tenido gripe en los últimos dos años, nuestro sistema inmunológico no está tan preparado para combatir el virus de la gripe.

Gripe y GOVID-19

Los investigadores están particularmente preocupados por la capacidad de los hospitales de Oregón para manejar aumentos simultáneos de casos de gripe y GOVID-19 que requieren hospitalización.

"Los modeladores nacionales esperan un resurgimiento de la gripe este año, además del virus GOVID-19 que también esperamos contraer durante el otoño y el invierno", di jo Peter Graven, director de la Oficina de Analítica Avanzada de la Universidad de Salud y Ciencias de Oregón (OHSU).

Según el último pronóstico de COVID-19 de Graven, los casos de COVID-19 deberían continuar disminuyendo hasta noviembre, cuando se espera que aumenten nuevamente.
