Big things are happening in Riverside AM 2. The Teaching Team (Susan, Katalin and Gina) have been working to support the success of a child in the class who is on a Guidance Plan. This child tends to escalate quickly and the school family is wrapping around him to develop skills. The teachers have been giving the children power to say "Stop!" (It does not always work.) Our Behavioral Specialist, Amber, suggested using Stop signs in the classroom. The Site Manager, Mary, took it one step further and suggested putting a Stop sign on the back of each child's name badge. Now the children want to wear their badges and all of the children (including the child who is on Guidance Plan) use them when needed. The Teachers, have them too and they work well.

This team is embracing the Power of Unity, "We are all in this together." Each of us is unique, yet undeniably connected to every other unique being in our world. By honoring both our uniqueness and our interdependence, we see that each individual has an important contribution to make to the welfare of our classroom, school, community and world. Thank you, Riverside Team, for seeing hurtful behaviors as a call for help. This is a wonderful strategy that you have graciously shared with us.



Family Literacy Program

Since 1995, The Listo family Literacy Program has offered culturally-specific literacy programming for low-income Spanish speaking families in Jackson County. The founders of Listo were veteran educators who noticed that schools and Spanish-speaking parents struggled to communicate when it came to their children's education. They built Listo on the four-pillar family literacy model begun in the 1980s as an approach to level the educational/economic playing field for impoverished families. Listo addresses each of the four pillars in the following ways:

ADULT EDUCATION - Free ESL classes, Adult Basic Education and GED preparation in Spanish

CHILD EDUCATION - Age-appropriate education support Birth-Grade 8

PARENT DEVELOPMENT - Establishing parents as child's first/most important teacher and advocate through parent leadership development activities

PARENT & CHILD TIME - Deepening parent/child bonds of trust and making time together as a family count, honoring cultural traditions

In March, Listo worked with 73 families - a total of 221 wonderful people!

77 adults

45 school age kids

79 little ones

Listo is a diverse team of caring professionals, many of us share the immigrant experience with the families we serve. We are 16 people, with all of our educators delivering services online. Here's a little about the folks you'll see around our office in the Blue Building on Beall Lane.
