Features: ASQ-3 Intervals

21 Questionnaire intervals (but we will use):

30, 33, 36 (spaced 3 months apart)

42, 48, 54, 60 (spaced 6 months apart)

*Intervals new to ASQ-3

Features: ASQ-3 Areas & Questions

5 developmental areas 6 questions in each area Response options: Yes, Sometimes, Not Yet

Written at 4th to 6th grade level

Features: ASQ-3 Overall Section

- Un-Scored Section
- Looks at quality of skills (e.g., speech)
 - Example: "Does your child use both hands equally well?"

- "NO" response indicates <u>possible</u> cerebral palsy; important to follow up

- Parent concerns are very predictive
- Any concerns or questionable responses <u>require</u> follow-up

ASQ-3 – How to figure out age

How to calculate age into months:
12 months x age= age in months
i.e 12 months x 3 years old=36 months

Scoring the ASQ-3

Step 1: Review responses. If any missing items, try to obtain answers. If item is inappropriate, omit item

Step 2: Calculate area totals: "yes"= 10; "sometimes"= 5; "not yet"= 0

Step 3: If any items omitted, calculate new area total (manual has instructions)

Step 4: Review overall section responses. Ask for further clarification and make notes if needed

Step 5: Transfer information to ASQ-3 Summary Page

ASQ-3 Score Interpretation and Recommendation for Follow-Up

Below cutoff in one or more areas

- Score is 2 standard deviations or more below average
- Refer for further assessment
- Rescreen

Parent Concern

- Respond to all concerns
- Refer if necessary


ASQ-3 Rescreens-Refer

Below cutoff in one or more areas

- Refer for further assessment
- Rescreen if any numbers in gray-typically the rescreen will happen in a month from the original screen and will occur at the center instead of the home.

Parent Concern

- Respond to all concerns
- Refer if necessary





Features of ASQ:SE

- 6-, 12-, 18-, 24-, 30-, 36-, 48-, and 60-month intervals
- Between 19 (6 month) and 33 (60 month) scored questions on each questionnaire
- 3–6 month administration window on either side of interval age

Features of ASQ:SE

- Questionnaires are written at a 4th- to 6th-grade reading level
- Each questionnaire includes open-ended questions related to eating, sleeping, and toileting
- All intervals include the question, "Is there anything that worries you about your baby (child)? If so, please explain."
- Each interval also includes the question, "What things do you enjoy most about your baby (child)?"

Features of ASQ:SE

- Competence and problem behaviors targeted
- Externalizing and internalizing behaviors targeted

•	Scoring Options	Points
	Most of the time	0 or 10
	Sometimes	5
	Rarely or Never	10 or 0
	Is this a concern?	Yes = 5

 High scores falling above empirically-derived cutoff points are indicative of problems

Interpreting Scores

- The "Sometimes" Issue
- The Subjectivity Issue
- Validity of Report
 - Teen parents
 - Parents involved with child protective services
 - First time parents/isolated parents
 - Parents actively involved with drugs and alcohol
 - Parents with mental illness

Questionable Scores?

- Gather additional information
 - Observe child
 - Use a professionally administered screening tool
 - Assess parent-child interactions
 - Assess the caregiving environment

Possible Follow-up

Below Cutoff

- Provide ASQ:SE activities and monitor
- Follow-up on any parent overall concerns

Close to Cutoff

- Follow up on concerns
- Provide information, education, and support
- Re-administer ASQ:SE
- Make referrals as appropriate
